




Cthulhu Box Kit

Assembly Instructions




Materials Needed:

- glue (I use 2P10 super glue for quick drying times but you can use whatever you want.
- sandpaper
- a 3/16" drive or pliers
- a small slotted screwdriver
- a tealight or some other candle wax



Lay your kit out and make sure it matches this picture. If not, please message us at gamerconcepts.com and we will send you anything you are missing.



Do the same with all the little tiny screws.



Note the backpiece has holes with indentations on one side. This side will face up.



Place the seven longer screws into the holes.



Set aside for later.



Take the lid and place the upper and lower guides like so.



Lightly sand the edges of the circular ends of the tentacles. Then apply some candle wax to the edges of that end. Just the circular bit.



Place all the tentacles and the center actuator as shown. Make sure the tentacles move freely. A little stiff is alright, it will loosen up with use.



Place the backpiece with it's screws through the upper and lower guide and the left-middle tentacle. This should hold the guides securely so you can test the movement of the tentacles. Sliding the middle-right tentacle up and down should make the upper and lower tentacles move in and out.



At this point you may put the facia on but just tack it down or use double stick tape just in case make some adjustments later.



Place the washers and nuts on the back of the lid and tighten down snugly. This should seat the screw heads into the wood. Then loosen the nuts 1/8 turn to prevent binding. Set aside the lid.



Get the box bottom and side and lay them out like this.




Take the bottom, right side, and back side and glue them together.



Grab the box front.



Gluing in assembly to the box front. Zooming in shows good placement of glue.



Get the left side and apply the glue but don't assemble the side just yet.



Get the lid and slide it into the right hinge and drop it onto the front tab.



Install the left side. Let the glue dry. If you're using a glue that dries slowly such as wood glue, Clamping the box will give you a better joint. Rubber bands make good clamps in a pinch.



If the box rocks from corner to corner, place some sandpaper down on your work surface and sand the legs until the box doesn't anymore.



Place a drop of super glue on the nuts to keep them from loosening up.



Congratulations. You now have a place to keep your precious* gewgaws in a place defended by tentacles. Tentacles, I say!
